Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I was reminded recently of a woman who attended a parish I attended many years ago. She didn't come often, and I didn't know her well. But one day, we were informed that she had been diagnosed with terminal cancer. The doctors said she only had several months to live. Faced with imminent death, she began to attend the Divine Services regularly, the priest prayed the prayers of healing for her, he anointed her with Holy Unction, and the rest of the parish community joined together in fervent prayer for her health. People prayed with tears for this woman whose life would soon end. Then something happened, something we didn't expect but we all hoped for: she was healed of her cancer. God heard our prayers and then brought about something that can only be called a miracle. Even her doctor, who was an atheist, called it a miracle. We all were so thankful that God had answered our prayers!

But then something else happened that we didn't expect. This woman stopped coming to church regularly, and then in time she returned to her old habit of coming only occasionally. We were all tempted to judge this woman and how quickly she returned to taking her life for granted, but if we are honest with ourselves, we all do this same thing.

How often have we prayed that a friend would recover from a serious illness, and they recovered? How often have we prayed for safety, and we were safe? How often have we prayed that there would be resolution to some conflict, and the resolution came? My friends, God has heard our prayers and answered so many of them. How have we responded to His grace and mercy? Do we get what we want and then

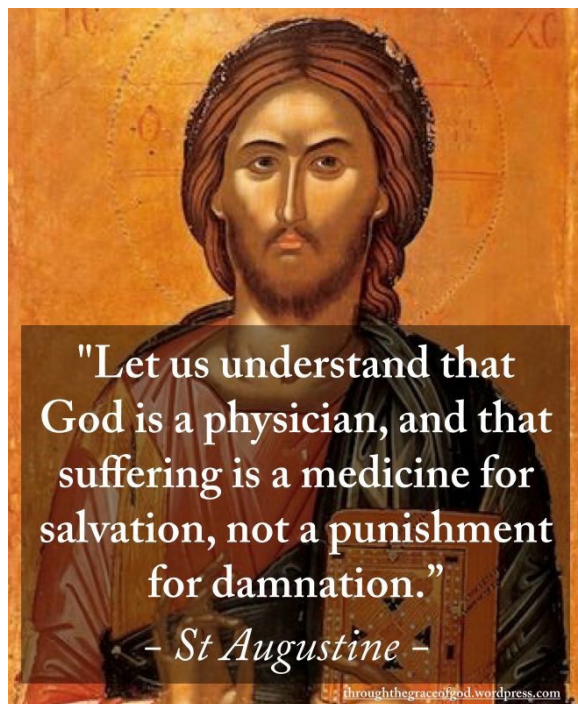

forget God? I am sad to say that we do this all too often. We receive a miracle from God and then forget Him after we get what we want.

St. Paul reminds the Christians in Thessaloniki to live a life that is always prayerful and full of thanks. He commends them to pray without ceasing and to give thanks in all circumstances. We are called to respond to these gifts with a prayerful and thankful heart.

I encourage each of us, myself included, to spend several minutes at the end of each day reviewing that day and listing all the good things God has given us that day. Let us end each day with a voice of praise and gratitude.
